Delta Plan Oversight: Habitat Restoration – Getting Tidal Marsh Restoration Done and Doing it Right (Information Item)

The Delta Stewardship Council has responsibility for overseeing the implementation of the Delta Plan, including its provisions for restoring the Delta ecosystem. To begin its oversight activities, the Council will receive the Delta Independent Science Board's report about the scientific research, monitoring, and assessment programs that support adaptive management of habitat restoration in the Delta (Water Code Sec 85820(a)(3)). In addition, staff has requested reports from several agencies about their activities to coordinate Delta restoration activities and restore tidal marshes (Water Code Sec 85210(h)).
